A prize of US \$500 or equivalent will be awarded to the winner.

The best essays will be selected for publication in *Gravesiana*.

Regulations:

- 1. Essays must be original, unpublished work in English and not exceed 3,000 words.
- Entries must be sent as an e-mail attachment in any standard word-processing format to: essay@gravesiana.org.
- 3. The competition is open to everyone, except for members of the Society's Council and their immediate families.
- 4. Entries received after the closing date will not be considered.
- Entries will be judged by the Council of the Robert Graves Society, which reserves the right not to nominate a winner if no entry is found to be of sufficient quality.
- 6. The Society reserves the right to announce publicly the name of the winner and to publish the best entries in *Gravesiana* and on its website, for which no separate payment (other than the essay prize) will be made.
- 7. The winner will be announced in the first issue of *Gravesiana* to be published after the announcement of the prize.
- 8. The winner will receive three complimentary copies of the issue of *Gravesiana* in which the winning essay is published.
